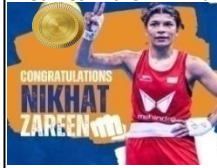
MEDAL WINNERS

NITU GHANGHAS (born 19 October 2000) is an Indian boxer who is 2023 world champion in minimumweight category and a two-time world youth champion in light flyweight. She won the gold medal at the 2023 IBA Women's World Boxing Championships and 2022 Commonwealth Games in the minimumweight category



NIKHAT ZAREEN

(born 14 June 1996) is an Indian boxer who is 2 time world champion. She won gold medal at the 2011 AIBA Women's Youth & Junior World Boxing Championships held in Antalya. Zareen won gold medals at the 2022 Istanbul, and 2023 New Delhi IBA Women's World Boxing Championships. She also won gold medal at the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games



LOVLINA BORGHOAIN

(born 2 October 1997) is an Indian boxer. She won a bronze medal at the 2020 Olympic Games in the women's welterweight event, becoming only the third Indian boxer to win a medal at the Olympics. She won gold medal at 2023 IBA Women's World Boxing Championships. In 2020, she became the sixth person from Assam to receive Arjuna



SAWEETY BOORA

is an Indian boxer who competes in middleweight weight class. She won the gold medal at 2023 IBA Women's World Boxing Championships and silver medal class at the 2014 AIBA Women's World Boxing Championships in the light heavyweight category. Her sister Siwi Boora is also an Indian boxer .

❖ **INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING SPORT FEDERATION (ISSF) WORLD CUP SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIP** : India won a silver and a bronze while China retained its top spot by winning two gold medals on the second day of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup shooting championship in Bhopal,MP. India's world champion Rudraksh Patil and R. Narmada Nitin won bronze in the 10m air rifle mixed team event, while Varun Tomar and Rhythm Sangwan won silver in the second event of the day to take India's medal tally to three including one gold, one silver and one bronze.

❖ **2023 ASIA CUP** will be the 16th edition of the Asia Cup, with the matches to be played as One Day International being hosted in Pakistan. The tournament will be played by 6 teams. It is scheduled to be held in September 2023 as a preparatory series before the 2023 Cricket World Cup. Sri Lanka are the defending champions. The five full members of the Asian Cricket Council will take part in the tournament: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. Asia Cup 2023 is likely to be held in Pakistan with another overseas venue to host India's matches. UAE, Oman, Sri Lanka and even England are potential contenders to host five matches including at least two India-Pakistan contests.

THE 2023 SWISS OPEN : 60TH EDITION (official and sponsored title: **Yonex Swiss Open 2023**) was an international badminton tournament that took place at the St. Jakobshalle in Basel, Switzerland, from 21 to 26 March 2023. The tournament offered a prize pool of US\$210,000 and was categorized as a Super 300 event.

ROHAN BOPANNA BECOMES OLDEST TENNIS PLAYER TO WIN ATP MASTERS 1000 TITLE:

Rohan Bopanna, a 43-year-old Indian tennis player, and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden have become the oldest duo to win an ATP Masters 1000 title. They won the men's doubles final at the Indian Wells Masters 2023 tournament in California.

As part of the 'Drowning Prevention Awareness' campaign, Indian Police Service (IPS) Krishna Prakash swam from Gateway of India to Elephanta Caves, Mumbai. He completed the expedition of 16.20 kms in just 5 hours 26 minutes and became the first person in history to do so. IPS Krishna Prakash started his expedition on March 26 at 7:45 am from Gateway of India in Mumbai.



The 16th edition of the IPL starts on Friday, March 31, with defending champions Gujarat Titans taking on four-time winner Chennai Super Kings at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad.

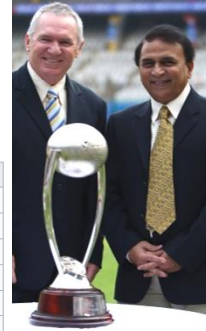

The **Border-Gavaskar Trophy** is an International Test cricket series played between India and Australia. The series is named after distinguished former captains, Australia's Allan Border and India's Sunil Gavaskar. It is played via the International Cricket Council's future tours. Before the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, India and Australia had played each other 50 times in Tests in a 49-year period from 1947 to 1996. Australia was the first country India toured soon after their Independence.
